Our Lord Jesus Christ was the perfect example of patiently doing and finishing the Heavenly Father's business (Luke 2:49).



2. Serving the Lord with many tears.

There are different kinds of tears. There are tears because of afflictions and trials. Another tear might be in the form of selfishness and loneliness. There are also tears of joy because of victories and successes.

But there is a kind of tear that is worthy of being placed inside the bottle, as a remembrance and a sweet smelly savor to our Almighty God. This tear is the tear of burden and compassion when our hearts are burdened and the Christ-like compassion is burning within our hearts. Our prayer life should be fervent and bathed in tears (Psalm 126:5).

When did we cry lately because of a burdened heart? How long has it been when we shed tears while pleading for someone to come to Christ? Jeremiah 9:1 says, "Oh that my head were waters, and mine eyes a fountain of tears, that I might weep day and night for the slain of the daughter of my people."

3. Serving in the strength of the Lord with many temptations and emerging victorious.

The tempter, the arch-enemy of our Lord is not yet in the lake of fire! He is still in the business of tempting and sowing discord among the brethren.
